The Midwest Climate Summit brought together climate leaders across sectors to spark conversation and collaboration to expand knowledge, accelerate climate action, and catalyze new partnerships. The Midwest Climate Collaborative (MCC), a group of more than 70 members working in academic, government, industry, and non-profit sectors, hosted the Summit, in which individuals across the 12 Midwestern states joined together to share, learn, and expand the conversation around work in agriculture, energy, sustainability, and more.

Leah Thomas, celebrated environmentalist and author, kicked off the summit as our keynote speaker. She discussed her midwestern upbringing and experience in coining the term, and title of her book, "Intersectional Environmentalist." Attendees engaged in a large variety of workshops, ranging from discussion of the Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund announcement to wetland restoration. Then, on the 5th, attendees took to the greater Indianapolis area in mobile workshops to experience local sustainability efforts. Attendees enjoyed React Theatre's student-written show, *Dreamland*, a work about eco-anxiety and enduring hope before being evacuated by a literal and figurative fire alarm, sending everyone back to their communities for future collaboration.
